Allocate funds to cover match required for the Nevada Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Demonstration Program.	Three Square Food Bank and FBNN	Pending.

Create a statewide recognition program for schools for high achievement in school wellness and compliance with the Nevada State School Wellness Policy.	SNHD and UNCE	Must consult with NDE.
Allocate dedicated funding for school wellness activities.	SNHD and UNCE	Must consult with NDE.
Mandate adequate time for meals and daily physical activity in schools.	SNHD and UNCE	Must consult with NDE.
Create a statewide program to reduce and recover school food waste.	SNHD and UNCE	Must consult with NDE.
Commission a statewide health impact assessment on school wellness.	SNHD and UNCE	Must consult with NDE.
Create State reduced price meal copay subsidy for school breakfast and lunch programs for reimbursement, initiating reduced-price eligible children to receive free meals.	NDA	Prioritize. Estimated \$1 million in General Funds to cover both .30 cent breakfast and .40 cent lunch per school meal subsidy for 16,000 reduced price qualifying children annually, statewide.
