
Track 4 Progress Update – Terry Kerns

Progress Since Last Meeting

- Hiring of the Law Enforcement Coordinator
- Presentations at Law Enforcement Summits in Northern and Southern Nevada
- Presentations at various community venues on Good Samaritan Law
- Surveying of Law Enforcement regarding needs for Naloxone
- Meeting with Coroners and EMS to explore improvements to reporting and data
- Commitment of funds for in-state incinerators

Priorities for Next 3 Months



Identify law enforcement activities that are working well within local communities and share practices that are appropriate for scaling

Public education and awareness regarding safe storage and disposal of excess medication

Explore use of an overdose map to monitor overdoses for purposes of public health and law enforcement

Criminal Investigator Position

- Henry Shlumpf
 - Hired January 16, 2018
 - Assigned to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Health Care Fraud Task Force (HCFTF)
 - Recently retired former FBI Special Agent
 - 38 year FBI career
 - Violent Crime and drug investigations
- Funded with Volkswagen settlement money received in October 2016
 - Position funded over course of five years
 - Funded through 2022

Naloxone

- \$250,000 transferred to Department of Health and Human Services
 - Purchase of naloxone/Narcan for law enforcement/first responders
 - DHHS ordered Naloxone for Law Enforcement partners
 - 22 agencies
 - 1155 doses of nasally administered naloxone
- Provided training to law enforcement
 - Two trainings completed
 - 63 Law Enforcement and first responders trained
 - Video and audio recorded for future remote use

Incinerators

- Purchased with settlement funds
 - Five incinerators strategically placed with law enforcement throughout the state
 - Used to incinerate prescription and illicit drugs seized or received through a take-back program
 - Five locations
 - Boulder City Police Department
 - Elko County Sheriff's Office
 - Mineral County Sheriff's Office
 - Nye County Sheriff's Office
 - Storey County Sheriff's Office
